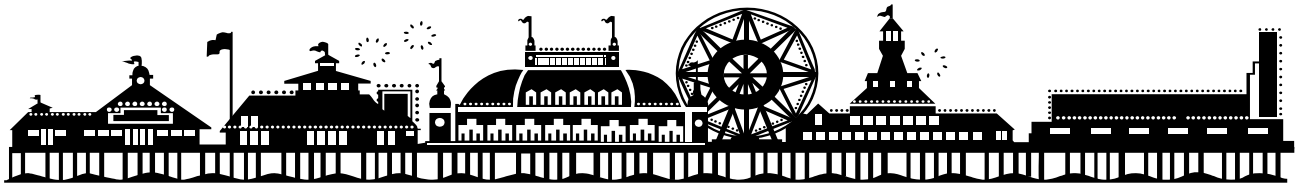

GENERAL FAIR RULES

Entries open to any boy or girl enrolled in 4-H, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, an FFA chapter, or a student enrolled in the Gilmanton School District. Open class entries open to any other individual.

All entry blanks should be returned to the 4-H fair secretary by June 28, 2019. Last-minute entry tags will be available on Thursday evening and Friday morning.

You do not need to be enrolled in a 4-H project to enter an exhibit in that section at the Gilmanton Fair. We encourage you to try new project areas.

Entries are limited to one entry per person per class.

All exhibits must be the result of work done by the member since the previous fair.

All exhibits must be placed on fairgrounds by 10:00 a.m. on Friday.

The exhibits should be brought to the ag/ tech shop area at the Gilmanton High School.

All exhibits must remain on grounds until 3:00 p.m. Sunday and removed by 4:00 p.m.

The Gilmanton Community Club reserves the right to withhold premium money for reasons of misconduct on behalf of the exhibitors at any time during the fair.

The decision of the judge is final.

The Gilmanton Community Club will not be responsible for any article stolen or lost or any injuries to anyone at any time during the fair.

All exhibitors must comply with the health regulations of Wisconsin Fairs as listed in the Buffalo County Fair Book.

Dogs and rabbits must be project animals of the exhibitor from March 31 of the exhibit year.

A showmanship contest will be held for all rabbits and dogs immediately following judging.

All members' ages are as of January 1 of this year.

All exhibits will be judged on Merit with four placings: 1st- 4th.

The winner of the Style Revue and the 2nd and 3rd runners-up of each class must agree to ride in the parade on Sunday. Failure to do so will forfeit prize money.

Prizes will be given to the best 4-H or FFA floats.

- First – \$35.00
- Second - \$30.00
- Third - \$25.00
- All others – \$20.00

The girl or boy must be 15 years of age or older as of January of this year. Individuals may only win once based on:

- Participation in club activities such as demonstrations, judging, number and quality of exhibits, style revue, etc. shall be considered.
- Work in junior leadership with younger club members.
- Interest in promotion of 4-H Club work.
- Completion of application blank in center of premium book.

Heel on leash and figure 8; stand for examination; heel off leash; recall (off leash); long sit and long down.

Heel on leash; stand for examination of leash; heel free and figure 8; drop on recall; long sit and long down (handler out of sight).
